

About Peace Lab for Youth (PLY)

Peace Lab for Youth (PLY) is a one-month initiative that starts with a workshop series and concludes with a summit that includes the participation of more than 40 youths from diverse participants across Malaysia, and 20 presenters from government agencies, civil society organisations, academia and businesses. PLY is one of INITIATE.MY's public advocacy initiatives to empower young advocates of peace and tolerance to build social resilience against violent and nonviolent extremism in Malaysia.

PLY recognises the role of youth in the promotion of peace, human rights and nonviolence. This is in line with the **United Nations Security Council Resolution 2250 (2015), 2419 (2018) and 2535 (2020).**





Peace Lab for Youth (PLY) Curiculum

The curriculum of PLY will focus on 5 themes that include:

Theme 1: Freedom of Religion and Belief (FoRB)

It will cover basic understanding of rights and protections in FoRB. It will further explore the interlinked issues such as hate speech and skills in peaceful conflict resolutions.

Theme 2: Radicalisation

It will cover basic understanding of the process of radicalisation as well as the impacts of extremism from a gender perspective. It will further explore ways and efforts to address radicalisation by government agencies, academia and civil society organisations.

Theme 3: Advocacy Tools

It will cover advocacy tools through education, arts & media, civil & political rights, dialogues and campaigns that will help participants design and implement their own project ideas.






Peace Lab for Youth (PLY) Curiculum

Theme 4: Advocacy Skills

It will cover advocacy skills that include project design and management, mental health, legal and security awareness as well as social media skills that will help participants effectively design and implement their own project ideas.

Theme 5: Project Implementation & Reporting

Participants are expected to design their project ideas that incorporate learnt knowledge, tools and skills to actively promote tolerance and prevent violence in Malaysian society. Technical support and mentorship will be provided to the participants by participating organisations. Finally, participants will report the implementation of their projects at the PLY Summit.

Dato' Ayob Khan Bin Mydin Pitchay Chief of Police, Johor

He is the current Johor Police Chief since 24th February 2020. He holds the rank of Commissioner of Police and has been in the forefront of Bukit Aman's efforts against terrorism for several years. He joined the Royal Malaysia Police in 1991 and has a Master's Degree in Information Technology from National University of Malaysia.

He was the Head of Counter-Terrorism Division (E8) of Special Branch Bukit Aman for six years. Prior to that, he has always been a part of the Bukit Aman team specifically in Special Branch. He was the Deputy Director of Special Task Force (of Operations in Counter-Terrorism Division) between July 2009 to February 2014 and the Staff Officer for Counter-Terrorism Section between the year 2006 to July 2009. He has experience as Staff Officer for Counter Espionage and as Desk Officer for African and Middle East Countries.

He was involved with numbers of high profile counter-terrorism operations such as against The Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), Al Qaeda, Daesh, and Jemaah Islamiyah among others. He is also actively involved in fighting corruptions, bribery and money laundering.

Dr. Ahmad El-Muhammady
Assistant Professor,
International Institute of Islamic Thought and Civilisation (ISTAC-IIUM)
Associate Fellow,

International Centre for Counter-Terrorism (ICCT)

He is an Assistant Professor at the International Institute of Islamic Thought and Civilisation (ISTAC-IIUM). Besides that, he holds various external positions such as Associate Fellow at the International Centre for Counter-Terrorism (ICCT), The Hague, Netherlands; International Advisory Committee Member at Global Peace Institute (GPI), United Kingdom, Associate Research Fellow at the Accounting Research Institute (ARI), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Malaysia, and Deputy Director, Alumni Relations Division (ARD), IIUM.

Since 2011, he works closely with the Special Branch's Counter-Terrorism Division, Royal Malaysia Police and Prison Department to implement the Rehabilitation and Deradicalisation programs for individuals detained under terrorism laws in Malaysia. Ahmad is also a member of Deradicalisation Panel and Expert/Specialist appointed by the Ministry of Home Affairs for cases investigated under the Security Offences (Special Measures) Act (SOSMA) 2012 and Prevention of Terrorism Act (POTA) 2015.

Prior to that, he was a consultant to the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) (2019), and co-authored a report on the return of foreign terrorist fighters in Southeast Asia. Ahmad also served as think-tank member (2014-2019) and consultant (2018-2019) to the Institute for Youth Research Malaysia (IYRES), Ministry of Youth and Sports Malaysia. He is now a Co-principal investigator for a two-year research at the IIUM-ISTAC's Extremism Analytical Unit in collaboration with the National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses of Terrorism (START), University of Maryland (2018-2020) and consultant to the Ministry of Home Affairs (MOHA) to develop National Action Plan for Preventing/Countering Violent Extremism (NAPPCVE) in Malaysia.

Alexej Boris Founder & CEO, InsideOut Academy

Alexei Boris is the Founder and CEO of InsideOut, a Germany-based Academy. He has been working in the prevention of extremism since 2012 and has built a company with around 100 employees that is independent of state subsidies. InsideOut runs programs and workshops on political education, prevention of extremism, radicalization and group-related misantrophy. The academy redefines leadership through its 'ToXiGames' program that imparts knowledge about leadership through physical self-awareness, applied practice with challenging groups and direct references to the global world through experience from extremism and radicalization.

Alexei and his team developed 'XGames', a radicalisation prevention game for adolescents and young adults. The adventure game is designed for use in schools and educational institutions, but can also be used in other contexts. The aim is to make adolescents and young adults aware of the simple ways their thoughts and actions can be influenced, thus boosting their awareness.





Aizat Shamsuddin
Project Coordinator,
Initiative to Promote Tolerance & Prevent Violence (INITIATE.MY)

He is an analyst and practitioner in the prevention of violent extremism (PVE), good governance, and human rights. Since 2015, he is the founder and project coordinator of Komuniti Muslim Universal. It was founded by former radicalised youth to counter extremism through counternarratives, dialogues and preventive policy engagements in Malaysia and Southeast Asia. In recognition of his work in peace and security, he received Australia Awards scholarship from Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and ASEAN in 2018. Then, he completed his master's degree specialising in counterterrorism, conflict studies and political Islam from the University of Melbourne in 2020. As part of his global network in counter-extremism initiatives, he is an alumnus of German Institute for Foreign Cultural Relations and American Council of Young Political Leaders since 2018. Aizat is also trained in Sharia and law for 5 years at the Islamic Science University of Malaysia. His altruistic hope is to make the world a better place.



Ain Nasiehah Researcher, Initiative to Promote Tolerance & Prevent Violence (INITIATE.MY)

She works in the development sector specialising in gender and peacebuilding especially in Southeast Asian context. She is an Asian Youth Peace Network (AYPN) member, a Southeast Asian youth network working on peace and conflict in the region. She has work experience in relation to project management, consultation, facilitation and research. Previously, she had also been involved in the capacity building of different segments of women in the community, from young women, refugees, migrants, indigenous people to professionals at the local level. She had 7 years of experience working with a number of local women's rights organisations namely, All Women's Action Society (AWAM), Tenaganita (refugee and migrants organisation) and Selangor Women's Empowerment Institute (IWB).

She is a Director of Business Development at Iman Research and has always been fascinated by identity. As a third culture kid being bounced from country to country, school to another, the tropics to temperate climate, she found how people identified themselves a great curiosity. It was only in 2004 when she joined Malaysiakini.com that she finally put her observations to paper, which then became a book, I Am Muslim. Today, she no longer writes for the Malaysian media as she left to found IMAN Research. Instead, she discusses religion in public life, and contributes to the CVE sector. She is fascinated how faith is political, sociological and emotional, and how it impacts lives. She has published three books, one of which is fiction, and hopes to have a new book out in November 2021.



Dr. Azmil Tayeb Honorary Secretary, Aliran

He is a political scientist who has done extensive research on political Islam, social movements and local government politics, particularly in Indonesia and Malaysia. Previously, he was a Fulbright fellow based at a pondok pesantren (Islamic boarding school) in South Kalimantan, Indonesia and an Erasmus Mundus fellow based at Humboldt University in Berlin, Germany. He received his PhD from the Australian National University. He is the author of "Islamic Education in Indonesia and Malaysia: Shaping Minds, Saving Souls" (Routledge, 2018). The book won the Colleagues' Choice Award for Social Sciences at the 2019 International Convention of Asia Scholars (ICAS) in Leiden, Netherlands.







Qyira Yusri Co-Founder & Education Director, UNDI 18

She is the Co-Founder and Education Director of #Undi18. #Undi18 is a Malaysian grassroots movement, spearheaded by a group of young people that successfully lobbied the Government and Parliament of Malaysia to take steps towards amending Article 119(1) of the Federal Constitution to reduce the minimum voting age in Malaysia from 21 to 18 years old. Qyira was previously a member of the National Youth Consultative Council. She is a Fellow at the Institut Für Auslandsbeziehungen (ifa) and a Democracy Discourse Fellow by the De La Salle University.

She is nominated by the US Embassy KL for the International Woman of Courage Award and was recently listed in Forbes 30 Under 30 for her work in Social Impact. With #Undi18, she leads the voter education initiatives by creating workshop modules and creative content to ensure that by GE15, Malaysian youths are prepared to vote. Some of the programs and initiatives that they have organized are Parlimen Digital, Seeds For Democracy, Youth Defence Summit, and more.



Jason Wee Co-founder, Architects of Diversity Malaysia (AOD)

He is the co-founder of Architects of Diversity Malaysia, a non-profit that aims to bridge communities and identity groups among youth for justice, peace and a sustainable future. AOD is an affiliate organisation under the United World Colleges movement. Jason has led various programmes and research projects on racial and religious misunderstanding and conflict, focusing on strengthening structures and systems to mend Malaysia's growing divide.







Hisham Muhaimi
Project Officer,
Komuniti Muslim Universal (KMU Malaysia)

He is the Project Officer at Komuniti Muslim Universal since 2017. His active involvement with KMU includes conducting advocacy training, workshops and seminars for youths and other stakeholders, particularly in the inclusion of religious minorities and gender equality under the framework of prevention and counter violent extremism (P/CVE). He has a background of Shariah and Law from Universiti Sains Islam Malaysia. As a YSEALI Alumni from the University of Nebraska-Omaha, Hisham is passionate about civic engagement, youth advocacy, community building and interfaith experience.



Khalil Majeed Co-Founder & Managing Editor, FaqCheck Lab

He is a co-founder and managing editor at Faqcheck Lab. He has spent nearly a decade working on investigations and producing documentaries across Malaysia. Khalil is also the Malaysian correspondent for Reporters Without Borders. Being fond of technology, his production repertoire includes virtual reality films. In his free time, Khalil can be found on his usual walking trails or in the kitchen testing recipes.





Khairi Anwar Writer & Director, Anomalist Production

He is a writer and director, for the stage and screen, based in KL mainly with his theatre company, Anomalist Production, where his works have travelled to Singapore and Indonesia. His first full length play, Teater Bangsa: Anak Kecil Main Api' (2015), won Audience's Choice Award in the 13th BOH Cameronian Arts Award.

His second play for the stage, which he co-wrote with Nell Hanan, 'HOME' (2016), toured to Singapore in September 2016. In 2018, his play 'IQ.Rock' (2018) was staged to critically acclaimed in April, was restaged later in September of the same year. IQ.Rock was nominated as Best of 2018 in the 16th BOH Cameronian Arts Award, together with nomination of Best Original Script, and won Best Supporting Actor.

Khairi directed and co-wrote POHLITHIK (2019) with Jamal Raslan in 2019, a story about the power of the student movement in Malaysia, and the play won Best of 2019 in the 17th BOH Cameronian Arts Awards.

Khairi's works have also been nominated for short film competition. 'Colourful' (2018) was nominated for Best Screenplay in BMW Shorties 2018, and 'Ralat The Musical' (2019), where Ralat was nominated for Best Director, Best Screenplay, Best Cinematography and Best Sound Design, and the short film takes home The Audience's Choice Award in BMW Shorties 2019.

(cont.) His latest stage play, '24 Jam Dalam 37 Tahun' (2020), directed by Christoper Ling and produced by Theatrethreesixy, had full houses when it premiered back in March with loads of rave reviews on social media.

Khairi also directed his first feature film in 2020, 'Mentega Terbang' (2020) where he co-wrote the story with his friends, questioning about religions and their different versions of the afterlife. The film was amongst the five finalists for Kuman Pictures Feature Film Challenge 2020, and is now touring in Malaysia and in international film festivals.

In 2021, Khairi made his debut in TV directing when he directed 'Megastar Academy' (2021) for ASTRO, a 2-episodes musical telemovie created and produced by Red Communications.

Khairi strives to tell and write more contemporary Malaysian stories, for his friends, and for the world.





Netusha Naidu President, Imagined Malaysia

She is the President of Imagined Malaysia, an NGO that advocates for better historical literacy, the exploration of alternative Malaysian histories, and locating Malaysian history within a regional Southeast Asian context. She was a Tunku Scholar at the University of Cambridge and graduated with an MPhil in World History.

She is also with Musawah, the global movement for equality and justice in the Muslim family. She joined the Malaysian women's rights movement in 1999 to address violence against women. This exposed her to challenges women face to have their rights recognised and exercised in a context of Islamisation within a democratic nation with parallel legal systems, where gender, ethnic, and religious diversities are celebrated in society yet negated at different levels of policies and laws. Before taking up SIS's helm, Rozana worked with several national, regional, and international women's rights organisations.



Azareena Abdul Aziz Programme Manager, Sisters in Islam (SIS)

She is the Programme Manager for Outreach and Empowerment for Sisters in Islam (SIS) a non-governmental organisation working on the rights of Muslim women within the framework of Islam. Azareena's scope of work includes advocating and organising SIS' programmes and activities that reach out to grassroots women, youth, activists, artists, syariah fraternity, syariah practitioners, stakeholders, parliamentarians and the general public on issues such as Islamic Family Law, Muslim women's rights, gender equality, child marriage, child born out of wedlock, freedom of religion, freedom of expression, Islamic fundamentalism and many more.





Mimie Rahman Co-Founder, Minda Kami

She is a mental health advocate who has been continuously working with adolescent and youth to amplify the unheard voices in Malaysia. Mimie has helped many young people by assisting them in receiving support and professional help within the online and offline sphere.

She graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Materials Science and worked as an engineer for a few years, she recognized her niche did not lie in the technical sphere. Mimie is currently doing her Masters in Guidance and Counselling and International Diploma on Mental Health, Human Rights & Law. She is also a fellow for Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiatives (YSEALI) and Building Bridges of the Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs. She incorporates intersectionality of mental health with socioeconomic, environmental and human rights perspective to create a comprehensive engagement with young people. Mimie is the co-founder of MINDAKAMI, a self-funded initiative committed in raising awareness of mental health and mental illnesses for young people in Malaysian.

Suri Kempe is an independent activist and consultant with over 15 years experience in gender equality, activism and community building, and law reform; working in diverse, multicultural communities, with a regional focus in the Asia/Pacific region. I have worked with the United Nations Development Programme and Malaysia's Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development; and in various leadership roles with civil society organisations including Family Frontiers, the Asia-Pacific Research and Resource Center (ARROW), and QueerLapis.







Firzana Redzuan Founder, Monsters Among Us

(Fir)zana Redzuan (She/Her) is a social media consultant working with ARROW's Information and Communications team. She is also a law graduate who has been called to the Bar after completing her 9 months of pupillage at a civil and criminal litigation firm. She obtained her law degree at International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) and she is currently enrolled in Diploma in Syariah and Practice at Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) in pursuit of advocating for Muslim women and families in Malaysia.

She is also the Founder of Monsters Among Us (MAU), a youth-led NGO that upholds children's rights and combats child sexual abuse. MAU was initiated as a symposium in 2017 when Fir was the President of IIUM's Asian Law Students' Association (ALSA IIUM) and is now registered as a society under the Registry of Societies. Since August 2020, she has been spearheading the Lapor Predator project under MAU, a child-friendly reporting chatbot for sexual crimes.

Recently, she was selected to represent P.097 Selayang for the newly launched Dewan Muda Malaysia assigned to the Ministry of Children and Youth as well as chosen as Malaysia's representative for the YSEALI Academic Fellowship Fall 2021.

For the past four years, Fir has spearheaded many youth centred initiatives to build awareness on child rights and equipping society, especially the children and young people on the dangers of sexual abuse.







Mohammad Alshatri bin Abdullah Senior Program Officer, SUARA RAKYAT MALAYSIA (SUARAM)

Currently working as Senior Program Officer at Suara Rakyat Malaysia (SUARAM). Five years of experience in handling cases of police misconduct and mistreatment in custody, including abuse and death in custody. I am also the coordinator for Police accountability and the IPCMC campaign for Malaysian Civil Society. Previously coordinated CSO's efforts toward the IPCMC bill before and after being tabled in Parliament. This effort includes consultation with various government agencies including Malaysian Human Rights Commision (SUHAKAM) and the Minister at Prime Minister's Office (Laws) late Dato Liew Vui Kiong and the PDRM. Now coordinates the #IPCMCNow campaign to galvanise public action to urge the government to establish the long overdue IPCMC in Parliament.

Also, a resource person for Sekolah Aktivisme SUARAM mainly on police power and your rights module, focusing on arrest procedures and rights during arrest and detention.

She plays a vital role in developing and implementing various digital marketing campaigns that helps broaden TechSoup's reach within Asia-Pacific. 








1. Percentage by Gender




2. Percentage by State of Residence






3. Percentage by Ethnicity




4. Percentage by Religion and Belief

5. Please rate your understanding about Radicalisation (with 1 being the lowest and 5 the highest).








7. Please rate your understanding about Advocacy Skills (with 1 being the lowest and 5 the highest).






